R.I.S.E. SURVEY REPORT

Embrace Relief's R.I.S.E. (Reach. Inspire. Support. Educate.) program is committed to empowering female educators in Tanzania by providing them with invaluable opportunities to ascend to roles as school administrators and supervisors. Through this initiative, participants are equipped with the essential knowledge and expertise they need to excel in their careers and, simultaneously, shape the future of education in Tanzania. The R.I.S.E. program offers scholarships to 24 women enrolled in comprehensive diploma courses for Educational Management and Administration (DEMA) and School Quality Assurance (DSQI), designed to create women leaders capable of spreading change within the country's primary and secondary education sectors.

The first class of scholarship recipients joined the R.I.S.E. program in the summer of 2021, beginning a two-year course of studies. Beneficiaries were selected for this program based on their previous academic achievement, and were required to maintain a high level of academic performance throughout their tenure. This initial class of 24 women successfully completed their diploma programs in mid-2023.

Upon their graduation, Embrace Relief conducted a survey of R.I.S.E. program participants, receiving responses from 20 of the 24. These surveys provide valuable insights into the real-world impact of the program and offer a glimpse into the significant strides made by these empowered women in the Tanzanian educational landscape.





SURVEY FINDINGS

After completing the program, almost all respondents found that R.I.S.E. had been very effective in improving their educational management and administrative skills, as well as their inspection and evaluation abilities. All respondents rated the DEMA program as "Very Effective," the highest possible rating, while 65 percent of DSQI respondents did likewise. An additional 20 percent of DSQI respondents rated the program "Effective," the second-highest possible rating.

Respondents also described a number of real-world techniques, learned during this program, that they had begun to implement in their roles as teachers and administrators. These included an enhanced ability in managing staff members, mobilizing resources to achieve school goals, conflict resolution, and teaching new skills to up-and-coming fellow teachers. Additionally, thanks to the skills they developed during the R.I.S.E. program, they have begun to establish reading, writing, and arithmetic clubs for children; conducted monitoring and assessment for their schools, and gathered resources to help their schools reach their goals. Their qualifications and skills will help the graduates further their own skills, while also leaving a long-term impact on Tanzania's schools, ensuring the benefits of the R.I.S.E. program ripple for years to come.




SDG 5
