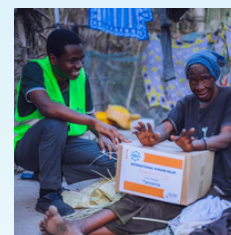
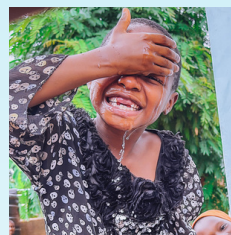
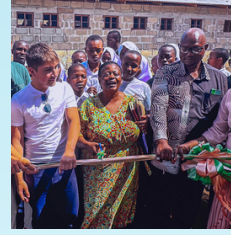




Embrace Relief's Year-End

Water Wells & Fountains of Hope

people gained a newly accessible clean water source in 2023 thanks to 122 completed water wells built or reconstructed

School bathroom project (Tanzania)

1,170

female students at the Mavurunza Primary School in Tanzania now have new, modern bathroom facilities, thanks to a project funded by the Maryland Turkish-American Inhabitants (MARTI) nonprofit in conjunction with Embrace Relief.

Mobile Market (USA)

families received nutritious, healthy food and household supplies from our mobile farmers' market at various distribution events in East Orange and Clifton, New Jersey.

September marked the beginning of Embrace Relief's monthly fresh produce distribution for families in need in partnership with the Clifton Health Department.

Cure Cataracts (Mali)

960

people have received **cataract surgeries** from our clinics and mobile health units located in and around Bamako.

14,400

people in Mali have received **health screenings** and **checkups** designed to detect health issues early.



Medical Camp (Uganda)

1K

people in Jinja received free medical treatment at a camp hosted by the Nile Humanitarian Development Agency in June. Students at the Bright Choice School raised money through Embrace Relief to support this event.



Medical Camp (Kenya)

1,500

people were provided with free medical checkups, medicine and other treatment at a clinic hosted at a prison in Nakuru. Embrace Relief partnered with the Light Academy, Omeriye Foundation, Kenya Red Cross, Lions Club, and the Kenya National Health Insurance Fund to stage this program.



WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT



R.I.S.E. (Tanzania)

24

teachers in our inaugural class at the ADEM School in Tanzania completed their degrees in educational administration in May. The graduates are all impacting Tanzania's educational system in new positions as school principals or school inspectors.

24

new teachers began their two-year course of study at ADEM with scholarship support from Embrace Relief.



Tailoring training (Kenya)

13

graduates of a tailoring training course in Githurai were gifted with sewing machines courtesy of Embrace Relief. These machines will allow the women to open their own small businesses making and selling clothing.

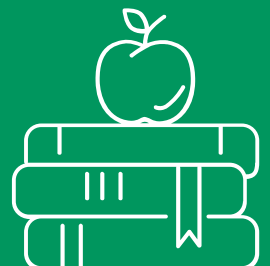
